**Subject:- Grant of Conditional Permission to Major S.D. Singh Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Baikunthpuri (baghar) Bewar Road, Fatehgarh, Distt. Farrukhabad-209625, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0256) with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 11 seats (instead of 12 seats) in 02 PG courses in the subject namely i) Prasuti & Stri Roga – 06 seats, ii) Shalya tantra – 05 seats [instead of 06 seats] for the academic session 2024-25 and relevant regulations thereunder-reg.**

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act,1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made there under shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made there under.

Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM Act, 2020 shall not be applicable.

1. Further, to assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Major S.D. Singh Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Baikunthpuri (baghar) Bewar Road, Fatehgarh, Distt. Farrukhabad-209625, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0256), inspection of your College was conducted on 30.01.2024 & 31.01.2024 and re-visited on 12.02.2024 & 13.02.2024 in hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the Conditional Permission with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 12 seats in 02 PG courses in the subject namely i) Prasuti & Stri Roga – 06 seats, ii) Shalya tantra – 06 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25.

The Board observed that the college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission for UG (BAMS) Course and PG courses in the subject namely i) Prasuti Tantra and Stri Roga – 05 seats and the college is not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission for PG courses in the subject namely i) Shalya tantra – 06 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 for the Academic Session 2024-25. However, the Board decided to issue Conditional Permission for the UG course and PG courses as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the Academic year 2024-25, wherein it is mentioned that:-

- a. "As per regulation 16,(1) & (2) of IMCC (Post Graduate Ayurvedic Education) regulations, 2016, the teacher-student ratio shall be such that the number of post-graduate teachers to the number of post-graduate students admitted per year is maintained as 1:3 in case of Professor and 1:2 in case of Reader or Associate Professor. The teacher student ratio shall be 1:1 in case of Lecturer or Assistant Professor having minimum of five years teaching experience."



Accordingly, as per the Hearing Committee observation and approval of Minutes in the 104<sup>th</sup> Board meeting of MARBISM, college is not fulfilling the required teacher student ratio in the following department for PG:-

**In the department of Shalya tantra (06 seats) - 01 Professors, 01 Associate Professors and 03 Assistant Professors are available and these 3 Assistant professors does not have the required experience of 05 years. There is a shortcoming of 1 Additional higher faculty. Hence, the college is fulfilling for 05 seats instead of 06 seats for PG in the department of Shalya tantra.**

**Hence, after applying the seat reduction policy 2024-25 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of conditional permission with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 11 seats (12 seats instead) in 02 PG courses in the subject namely i) Prasuti & Stri Roga - 06 seats, ii) Shalya tantra - 05 seats [instead of 06 seats] for the academic session 2024-25 under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020.**

Therefore, **conditional permission is issued to Major S.D. Singh Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Baikunthpuri (baghar) Bewar Road, Fatehgarh, Distt. Farrukhabad-209625, Uttar Pradesh (Inst. ID AYU0256) with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course and 11 seats (12 seats instead) in 02 PG courses in the subject namely i) Prasuti & Stri Roga - 06 seats, ii) Shalya tantra - 05 seats [instead of 06 seats] under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25 subject to the condition that college is fulfilling the following requirements: -**

- I. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
  - II. It is further informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 100 seats and 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity with 11 seats (instead of 12 seats) in 02 PG courses shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2024-25 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
  - III. It is also informed that determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
11. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
  12. Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
  13. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
  14. **The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31<sup>st</sup> December, 2024 and compliance report should be submitted to the MARB-ISM, in order to be considered for the grant of conditional permission for the academic session 2025-2026:**
    - i) All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto
    - ii) All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in the NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
    - iii) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2022;
    - iv) All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Postgraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016;
    - v) The shortcoming mentioned in Point no. 5 above.



15. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2025-26.
